Martimiano Morales Carreon worked at an avocado grove so that his four children could attend college. Tragically, December 14, 2010, he died after getting his leg caught in a wood chipper machine.

Mourn for the Dead, Fight for the Living!



- On January 12, 2012 a Northern California man, Martin Lara, who was decapitated in a wood-chipping accident appears to have gotten stuck in a rope while feeding something into the industrial-sized machine, authorities said.
- On October 12th, 2011, 16-year-old Armando Ramirez and 22-year-old brother Eladio died when they were cleaning out a tunnel at Community Recycling and Resource Recovery, Inc., a large scale waste facility in Lamont, California. They both collapsed, suddenly overcome by hydrogen sulfide. Family members reported that the brothers were not provided with any safety protection other than a flimsy painter's mask and rubber boots.
- On January 2012 after a series of inspections at four mega-warehouses in Chino, Cal/OSHA's High-Hazard Unit has issued dozens of citations, almosts half of wich are classified as serious, totaling \$256,445 jointly against National Distribution Centers and its staffing agency, Tri-State Staffing, for violations such as delayed treatment of a worker stricken by indoor heat and failure to provide and mantain safety equipment.

What are workers doing? A Week of Actions!

Increasing Workplace Awareness

- Hold candlelight vigils
- Build an altar in the break room
- Dress in black or wear union colors
- Wear stickers/buttons with a health and safety message
- Lay out empty shoes to symbolize those who have died at work
- Plan a Learn-at-Lunch and show a movie related to workers' rights

Preventing Injury/Illness

- Report current hazards and injuries/illnesses
- Work with your employer to create a health and safety committee
- Review OSHA 300 logs, safety records and IIPP
- Investigate job hazards using surveys, inspections, body mapping and/or hazard mapping
- Support laws that protect workers at the state and federal level
- Join other organizations who are hosting events
